E-Safety for Parents

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KEY STAGE 1

Pupils should be taught to:

'Use technology **safely** and **respectfully**, **keeping personal information private**; identify where to go for **help and support** when they have concerns about **content** or **contact** on the internet or other online technologies.'

KEY STAGE 2

Pupils should be taught to:

- 'Use search technologies effectively, appreciate how results are selected and ranked, and be discerning in evaluating digital content.'
- 'Use technology **safely**, **respectfully** and **responsibly**; **recognise acceptable/unacceptable behaviour**; **identify a range of ways to report concerns about content or contact**.'

How to control your content...

- Limit posts to be seen by 'friends' and not 'public'
- Click 'Protect my Tweets' so only approved users can see them
- In 'Edit your Profile', change the 'Posts are Private' feature to 'On'
- Make videos private by adjusting 'Broadcast and Sharing Options'

REPORT ABUSE

When should I report to CEOP...?

- If you are being asked to **do something** that makes you **feel uncomfortable**
- If someone is being **insistent on meeting up**
- Maybe **inappropriate chat** messages you are receiving
- Someone acted **aggressively** or **threatened you** online, or another child you know
