

# E-Safety Champions



## E-Safety aims for 2018-2019:

- To involve pupils in solving problems, offering help and advice to other pupils when needed.
- To establish an e-safety newsletter to inform parents and children about important e-safety updates.
- To deliver e-safety assemblies which are suitable for KS1 and KS2 pupils.
- To organise a whole school safer internet day/week (February 2019) to update our knowledge about online safety, and to try out different activities and games to try out different activities and games with the help of the E-Safety Champions.
- To provide all pupils with opportunities to develop skills that will be important throughout their lives.

## E-Safety Champions:

- The E-Safety champions will be made up of two representatives from each class from Year 3 to Year 6.
- Each class will elect a girl and a boy to be their representatives.
- The E-Safety Champions will meet fortnightly, on a Wednesday afternoon.

## Term of Office:

- Elections for E-Safety Champions will take place in September.
- All E-Safety Champions members will serve for the whole academic year.

## Responsibilities of E-Safety Champions:

- Class Champions will report back to their class after every meeting.
- A meeting will be held fortnightly, on a Wednesday afternoon.
- Class representatives will take issues brought up by their class to the meetings or to Miss Donovan if they need more urgent attention.
- They should put across the views of their class, not their own opinions.
- Year 5 and 6 representative may attend Year 1 and Reception classes to share information and communicate their views.
