Weekly essentials:

Times tables:

Focus on your target times tables. By the end of Year 1, all children are expected to be able to count in multiples of 2, 5 and 10 and be able to recall all of the doubles and halves to 10.

Reading:

Year 1 children should read every day for 15 minutes. Remember to make a comment in your diary so we know when books need to be changed! These will be checked on a **daily** basis. Work on your fluency. How many words can you read in a minute? It is expected for a Year 1 child to read between 60-90 words a minute.
